Notes:

History elective courses are categorized in 3 ways to ensure exposure to a significant breadth of historical idea:

- 1. Courses are pre-modern or modern in content. At least 2 of the electives must be pre-modern (pre-1500) in content. This is indicated after all course descriptions by a P or an M.
- 2. Courses are either western or non-western in content. At least 2 of the electives must have a non-western focus. This is indicated after all course descriptions by a W or an N.
- 3. Courses are also categorized according to theme, and at least one course must cover each of the following themes: Sex & Gender; Class, Race, & Ethnicity; and Institutions and Society.

A minor is not required but students are encouraged to select and complete a minor to complement their degree.

An internship is also not required for the History major, but students should strongly consider finding one to complete before graduation.
